



# The Ottawa Supportive Housing Network

HousingPlus combines stable, affordable housing with on-site services that help people live stable and successful lives and be contributors to stronger and safer communities.

The Ottawa Supportive Housing Network is a coalition of non-profit housing agencies that are working to provide these services and reduce the pressure on other more costly social services, shelters and emergency health care.

### *Ancoura*

Provides a nurturing and fulfilling environment for adults living with a mental illness, through stable, affordable housing and a supportive community.

### *Bruce House*

Transitional housing for people living with HIV/AIDS who are homeless or at risk of homelessness and require various levels of support to maintain housing.

### *Cornerstone*

Permanent supportive housing for women who are homeless or are at risk of homelessness and require support to maintain housing.

### *Daybreak*

Rent-geared-to-income housing for low-income single adults who are homeless or are at risk of homelessness and require support to maintain housing.

### *Emily Murphy*

Affordable housing and support services in a townhouse setting for single parents and their children. Support services include children's programming, housing support and parenting information.

### *Harmony House*

Affordable, safe transitional housing for women and their children who are survivors of violence, providing housing for up to one year, along with a program of individual and group support, accompaniment, advocacy and referral.

### *Options Bytown*

Permanent, affordable housing and support services for single adults with a history of homelessness, addictions or mental illness.

### *Ottawa Salus*

Rehabilitation services, community support services, recreation and housing to men and women, 16 years of age or older, with mental health problems. Salus services are available in English, French and ASL.

### *Shepherds of Good Hope*

Affordable housing for single adults with ongoing mental health problems, who are at risk of homelessness.

### *Youth Services Bureau of Ottawa*

Affordable housing apartments for single youth aged 16 to 21 who are homeless, at risk of homelessness or are unsuitably housed. Supports focus on life skills, safety planning, crisis and short-term counselling.

### *Youville Centre*

An innovative centre that provides motivation, education and nurturing to young teen mothers (up to age 21) and their children. Services include high-school education, early child development and care, student support and supportive housing.
