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WHAT Is Supportive Housing?

Supportive housing is a community-based, person-centred model of providing affordable, permanent accommodation. Housing support staff assists individual tenants in attaining their optimum quality of life and encourage the development of healthy communities.

Supportive housing communities reduce the cycles of institutionalization, homelessness and poverty among people who need assistance in maintaining independent housing.

WHY Is Supportive Housing Unique?

Supportive housing for people significantly reduces the isolation and loneliness that are often the consequences of living with mental illness and other disabilities and disadvantages. The pressure on other more costly services can be reduced by providing those in need with on-site supports. Supportive services can include community referrals, assistance with life skills, assistance maintaining housing and opportunities for peer support and community involvement.

Supportive housing is a healthy alternative to emergency shelters for those who move directly from hospitals and recovery homes.

WHO Provides Supportive Housing in Ottawa?

We are a coalition of supportive housing projects in Ottawa. Each project is run by a community-based non-profit agency. In total, there are approximately 800 tenants living in supportive housing in Ottawa. Our estimate is that another 2000 units are needed.



WHO Are Our Community Partners?

As community-based agencies, we enjoy both the financial support and the volunteer contributions of many generous individuals. In addition, we receive funding and work in partnership with the municipal, provincial and federal levels of government and a host of private foundations and community agencies and social housing providers and associations.
